Minutes of Previous meeting were read and confirmed.  
A warm welcome was extended to Miss Reed as our new member of staff.

1. SCHOOL FEES

It was agreed to charge a school fee of 1/6 per year, irrespective of money deposited for school books and equipment.

\* 2. Johnston Falls

Agreed to send £6.15.0 towards the current years fees, being half of the amount due for the three boys.

3. MUTANDA SITE

Agreed that another 100 acres on the Mutanda Site is an argent necessity having regard to the growing work; and that the Mukinge Hill Staff be consulted as to making application at once.

4. NATIVE CHURCH ELDERS

It was suggested that every four months all church elders should gather here to report on the Christians and Church members in their respective districts.

1. UNIVERSAL WEEK OF PRAYER

It was proposed and agreed to call in Church Elders for the first week in January.

2. JOHN'S LETTER

A letter was read from John Pupe addressed to the various village churches.

3. PREACHERS' PASSES

It was suggested that Preachers' Passes should only be issued to Catechumens of one year's standing and that the first pass be issued on six months' trial.

4. HUTS FOR PREACHERS

Agreed to erect some huts for use of Voluntary Preachers coming in for instruction.

5. CATECHUMEN

Application for Catechumenship must be made to the Leader of the village Church, and when passed by the Christians at the Local Church his name must first be submitted to the Mission Station for entry in the Church roll; before this is done he should not be reckoned as a Catechumen.

1. GIRLS' SCHOOL

Staff is unanimously in favour of separating the girls from the boys' school and building a girls' compound, Miss Shoosmith to teach and have the care of these girls. No application is being made, at present, to Headquarters for funds; it is being hoped that the native Christians will do something to help in the erection of a school building and provision of food for the girls.

2. JOHNSTONE FALLS

It was agreed to send Mosesa to Johnstone Falls for the Teacher Training Course, and that Tito should return for a further year, if his certificate should not be granted.

3. NATIVE CONFERENCE

1. MOSESA

In view of the fact that boys are required to pass St. IV before entering for the Teacher Training Course, it was decided to keep Mosesa in school for a further 12 months.

Tito returned to Johnstone Falls in September.

2. NORTHERN RHODESIA MISSIONARY CONFERENCE

Letter from Mr. Watson read and discussed at length, and reply framed.

3. BOMA SCHOOL

Mr. Nelson reported the very poor attendance at this school; and the advisability of continuing it under such circumstances was discussed. It was finally agreed that Mr. Wallace, (the D.C.) should be asked to encourage attendance, and that for the present the school should not be closed.

1. JOHN PUPE'S ALLOWANCE

It was agreed to add 2/6 per month from Church Offerings to John's allowance; and that Munguya should be paid the same amount as John, provided that he undertakes to permanently do the same Church work as John. If he is determined to come into school next year, his allowance should continue to be 15/- until he enters school when it would automatically stop.

2. APPLICATION FOR PURCHASING MUTANDA SITE

Staff agreed that Mr. Nelson should enquire of the District Commissioner as to the possibility of a Government surveyor passing through in the near future, with a view to the purchase of the Mutanda site, of not less than 250 acres, if the Government will consent to do so before the expiration of the present lease.

3. TEACHER TRAINING

A discussion as to the possibility of sending three boys (Mosesa, Sondashi, and Mako) to Mazabuka this year, for the Teacher Training, occupied some time, but no decision was arrived at.

4. NATIVE CONFERENCE

This letter was read and the various points discussed. Each worker was asked to be prepared to bring to Staff Meetings any problems of Administration or particular difficulties in any phase of the work for open discussion.

2. MISS BOKE'S LETTER.

A letter was read from Miss Boke of Kafulafuta asking permission for an Evangelist to visit our workers on the border and that an interchange of fellowship be started.

Mr. Nelson was asked to reply to this letter pointing out the trouble that resulted from a visit of Evangelists some time ago owing to the talk by these men in comparing the Policy of the respective Missions.

3. AMALGAMATION OF SCHOOLS

A letter was read from Mr. Foster dealing with this subject. Discussion followed and it was suggested that we think out the pros and cons of this matter by the next Staff meeting in preparation for discussion at D.C.

4. MISS SHOOSMITH'S DRY SEASON WORK

Miss Shoosmith asked the meeting if they had any suggestions for work to be done by her during the Dry-Season months. It was suggested that she attempt some translation work in view of the need for more vernacular literature.

2. KALILELE NATIVE AUTH. SCHOOL.

A letter from the Education Dept. was read concerning this school. The point at issue was the closing of Mukabe school and the transferring of Uledi to the Native Authority School. This matter was discussed at length. It is with great reluctance that we are closing down our Mukabe School but feel ourselves forced into this position.

Staff however agreed providing that in the event of this Native Authority School being closed Uledi returns to Mission employ.

3. TEACHERS SALARIES

Teachers salaries have been brought up to Government scale. We propose to continue this rate of pay so long as government holds to their present policy of paying all salaries over  $5\frac{1}{2}$ - per month.

4. VISITING

Kalilele's country has been visited since last staff meeting.

A letter re Regional Conference was read asking the Staff to consider time and place of the said Conference. Staff agrees with Executive's proposal that R.C. be held at Mukinge Hill about the latter part of May or the beginning of June.

3. NATIVE OFFERING

It was felt necessary to educate the believers in the matter of giving. Lately there seems to have been a falling off in bringing gifts in kind and money.

It was suggested that we revert to the card system of offering and notice to be given of this at the next Sunday service.

4. WEEK OF PRAYER.

It was suggested that the week of prayer be held this year from December 29th to January 4th.

5. SAMUEL

Samuel has come to the Station with family for medical treatment and is anxious not to return to Kasung'ami Shilenda owing to the fact that there are so few people living at that village. His position was discussed.

6. NURSE

The Mutanda Staff is feeling more and more the need for a nurse. Mr. Frost who is in charge of the medical work is out on district work often and even when on the Station there are many cases which can only be nursed by a woman. Miss Shoosmith is unable to carry on her school work efficiently because of the demands upon her time and strength in attending to these cases. Therefore we ask that this need be added to Staff Requirements of D.C. 1940, as an urgent need.

It was suggested that if this offer be accepted he visit the village of Lwambula regularly, and a list of villages for which he should be responsible be given him to abate any tendency to overlapping Lazalo's work. It was suggested that an allowance of only 5/- be made for moving owing to the fact that he has been such an expense to the Mission.

3. SALARIES OF OLDER EVANGELISTS

A letter from Mr. Foster re increased salaries for Senior Evangelists was read. The Mukinge Church has suggested that Senior Evangelists wages be made up to £1 per [ ] from Church funds. It was agreed by Staff to accept this proposal for Mutanda Senior Evangelists.

4. VISIT TO YOWELA AND KALILELE

Mr. Nelson proposed visiting these two centres early in May.

5. WOMEN'S SCHOOL

A suggestion was made that a small building be <sup>erected</sup> ~~erected~~ for women's School and that the cost of the building be paid for out of Girls School Fund.

1. SALARIES FOR SENIOR EVANGELISTS

This matter was discussed at Regional Conference and the Mutanda Staff felt that they preferred to wait before increasing these salaries until the matter was broached by the Church. At Present only two are classed by us as Senior Evangelists namely John and Munguya.

2. WOMEN'S SCHOOL BUILDING

It is still in the minds of Staff Members to erect this building but owing to other building work on hand it may not be possible to make a start yet.

3. NATIVE CONFERENCES

The proposed dates for the Conferences are as follows:-

Mutanda	August 5th-August 10th
Iowela	August 20th-August 24th.

4. TEACHER'S PAY AND DAYS OF SCHOOL

Teachers are expected to run their schools from August 15th - April 15th. and in this time put in 150 days of teaching. If the teacher by reason of putting in extra days to bring up his total days to 150<sup>+</sup> closes school before April, 15th he does not get pay for the days he saves. Teachers are to be informed not to conduct school on Saturdays. Teachers are to be encouraged to do week-end preaching in nearby villages.

5. MUNGUYA.

Staff agrees that Munguya take up Shamende's work at Kabangu.

Staff decided Teachers are to receive pay for whole year. The school year including the 1 month allowed for holidays is from 1st August to May 31st. Teachers are to receive pay if they agree to work during June and July. A refresher course is expected to be held the last two weeks of April.

3. TEACHERS WIVES AND PAY

Mr. Frost was asked to get an idear of the qualifications of the teachers' wives and the government be the ones to decide whether they qualify as helpers who receive pay.

4. FINANCES

A statement of finances was given by Mr. Nelson.

5. CONFERENCE

6. SAFIKI

Safiki was to be interviewed by representative Church Members with a view to his being accepted as a candidate for Bible School, as he himself had expressed a desire for entrance into Bible School.

MATTERS ARISING:

1. TEACHERS WIVES

A report was given by Mr. Frost of his findings during a recent tour of the Out-schools. He was asked to write to the Government re the capabilities of these women.

2. SAFIKI

Safiki, going to Bible School has been approved by the Church and he has already proceeded to Mukinge Hill for training.

3. BIBLE SCHOOL

Three boys have left Mutanda District for training in the Mukinge Hill Bible School. They are Dany, Kalubenyi and Safiki.

4. FINANCES

A detailed statement of finances was given by Mr. Nelson.

5. BIBLE SOCIETY

A gift of £4 has been sent to the British and For, Bible Society the result of special offerings given by the local Churches.

6. BOYS FOR TRAINING

Prior to staff meeting it had been decided by staff members to send three boys for training to Chitokoloki. They were: Peter, Shadrack and Zabuloni.

The boys have to pay an annual fee of 7/6. These fees are being paid by the Mission until such time as the boys will be able to refund the money.

7. SCHOOL AT KALILELE

Mr. Frost brought back a report from the Kalilele Christians in which there was expressed a keen desire for a school to be opened in their area. The staff expressed their willingness to open a school as soon as ever possible.

8. RADIO

A letter had been received from the Education Department offering assistance in the purchase of a radio. This to be used in Educational and News Broadcasts. Mr. Nelson was asked to get more particulars of this matter when attending the Education Committee Meeting at Ndola.

9. HELPER FOR YOWELA CHURCH

Yowela Church has recommended that Falo be appointed as a helper to assist Lazalo in his work.

Staff agrees to this recommendation.

Since last Staff Meeting a visit has been paid to Shilenda's country.

2. FINANCES

3. DONATION FROM G.B.S.

A donation of £5 has been made by Girl's Boarding School to the Medical Fund.

4. APPLICATION FOR INCREASED GRANT

It was suggested that an application for an increase in the Grant for the Medical Work be made to the Senior Medical Officer of Ndola owing to the present high cost of drugs and Medical requisites.

5. SONDASHI KAFUTA

A letter was read from Sondashi Kafuta asking if his removal to Shilenda's country would be considered by the Mission. After some discussion it was decided that while the Mwilu School continues to operate we should not be willing for this transfer - or until such a time as a suitable substitute could be found for the school.

Mr. Frost was asked to get particulars when visiting next month as to whether Mwilu expects to stay at his present site or remove to the Congo.

6. KABANGU SCHOOL

A letter was read from Mosesa stating that in the event of Kabangu village going to a new site the Headman was willing to assist the erection of a New School Building. Mosesa and Munguya to be consulted re choice of site for school

7. BRUSHO

It was suggested and approved by staff that Brusho reside at Kanda-Kanda's village on returning to Mutanda from training at Jeanes School.

8. G.B.S. BUILDING

An application for a Grant for Building had been made on the recommendation of the Provincial Education Officer. A letter was received from Government making an offer of £25 on the £ for £ on basis. An order for anti-coursing was to be sent to L.H. Robinson and in the event of this not being procurable it was decided by staff to put off building the New Girls School until after the war. Other necessary buildings and repairs will be done during the Dry season.

(a) Mwilu: It was reported that Mwilu intends to stay at his present site and therefore staff considers that Sondashi stay where he is.

(b) Kabangu: The Headman was informed of our desire to have the teacher and evangelist assist in the choice of the new village site.

2. FINANCES

A statement of station finances was given by Mr. Nelson.

3. REFRESHER COURSE

It was decided that the dates for the teachers refresher course be from April 19th - 29th. A programme was to be made before hand and members of staff expressed willingness to do what they could to make the time as profitable as possible.

4. KAZHINGU

It was suggested that Kazhingu be relieved of the responsibility of the evangelistic work in Shilenda's territory and that another man to be sent to take over the leadership of the work.



5. SAMUEL

A report on the work that Samuel has been doing for the past six months shows that he is falling short of what is expected of him as a fully paid evangelist. It was suggested that he be talked to about this at the first available opportunity.

6. VACATION WORK OF TEACHERS

Three centres were suggested as likely places for teachers to work during the school vacation months of June and July. They were:- Shitonyi, Shilenda and Shikelenge. Other places were to be suggested later if teachers were available.

7. DRY SEASON'S WORK

(a) Treks: It was suggested that the following districts be visited in the coming months - Shilenda, Matebo, Mumena. Along the motor-road to Kitomambo Kalilele and Mujimanzovu.

(b) Buildings: The following houses were to be erected during the season:-

2 MATTERS ARISING OUT OF MINUTES

(a) Kazhingu: After the Staff Meeting of April 3rd Mr. Nelson and also a representative Church meeting spoke with Kazhingu and found out that certain charges made against him were without foundation. This being so it was agreed that he continue his preaching work and not be asked to stop as was previously suggested.

(b) Samuel: An inspection of Samuel's preaching book seemed to suggest that although he was not going so far afield as we should like he was conscientiously doing his work. His responsibility to preach in the villages along the Kafue in Kikola's country was again pointed out to him and it was suggested that he visit this area at least on three occasions during the year.

(c) Vacation Teaching: It was suggested that Mosesa at first prospect in the Shitonyi area and on finding the most suitable centre from which to work send for the necessary equipment. Other teachers were to be responsible for making their own arrangements.

All certificated Teachers had expressed willingness for this vacation work.

3. FINANCES

A statement of finances was read by Mr. Nelson.
